## Mark Your Calendars and Register for the 2023 Dairy Cattle Welfare Symposium

DALLAS FORT WORTH, Texas - Registration is now open for the 2023 Dairy Cattle Welfare Symposium: *Promoting dairy cattle welfare and ethics through science and implementation of best practices.* The program will be held on May 17-18, 2023 at the Hilton Forth Worth located in Fort Worth, Texas. The Dairy Cattle Welfare Council (DCWC), a growing organization formally established in 2016, is hosting the event.

This symposium brings together dairy farmers, veterinarians, consultants, universities, students, retailers, and others in the dairy community. Cost of registration for the full program is \$380 until April 1, 2023. Student registration is \$120 and is limited to 30 students. The two-day program will offer 12 hours of continuing education credits for veterinarians as well as credit from ARPAS, PAACO, and The FARM Program.
